TOWNSHIP OF OCEAN SEWERAGE AUTHORITY REGULAR MEETING

Oakhurst, NJ

April 3, 2018

A meeting of the Township of Ocean Sewerage Authority was held on the above date at the Authority Administration Building, 224 Roosevelt Avenue, Oakhurst, New Jersey.

Chairman Galvin called the meeting to order.

All recited The Pledge of Allegiance.

The Chairman announced that the Meeting was being held in conformance with the Open Public Meetings Act of 1975 and that adequate notice has been duly posted where required and mailed to the Asbury Park Press and the Coaster in accordance with the law.

WORK SESSION

Executive Director's Report. The Director advised that he received two resumes from individuals who are interested in working this summer. One of the resumes was from a person who is currently attending Georgia Tech in the engineering program. The Director contacted her and found that she has had some experience with GIS. She would be available after May 22. TOSA has been interested in getting work done on a GIS program as well as other projects such as the Asset Management Plan, and she may be a good candidate for that work. However, in order to hire her TOSA would need to obtain GIS equipment. The Chairman suggested that we contact the Township about their GIS system. Mr. Schmeling will follow up on this matter.

There was discussion on the Asset Management Plan. Mr. Schmeling noted that Greeley and Hansen have a lot of information that would be helpful for this project including photos of TOSA equipment.

With regard to the outfall pipe, there is a picture of the design, which shows a change of the location of the leg from the north side to the south side of the pipe. The reason for the change is an analysis of the forces that would affect the pipe from the waves and wind, and the change would provide less strain on the pipe. Bill Hall examined this analysis and approved the change. Mr. Hall will include this in his final report and will provide a copy to TOSA for review.

Attorney's Report. Mr. Bonello said that he had nothing new to report.

<u>Engineer's Report.</u> It was not necessary to have the engineers present at this meeting, as there was nothing new to report at this time.

Operation Manager's Report. Mr. Kwityn had nothing to add to his written report.

Operations Managers Report For March 2018

Plant:

Discharge piping from the thickener to holding tank clogged. The sludge got to thick and the hoses pumps could not pump it.

High flows due to heavy rains.

New heaters were installed in sludge building.

Started getting together parts to install a polymer feed system for the clarifiers. This will be used only when needed. This will be installed in the PSA building in an unused corner out of the way. We will be doing all the work in house no contractors.

Operations

Met with Asbury Park Fire Department, went over shared services agreement.

Collections System Foreman reported a hop smell and golden water discharge in the Burkes line. The only place it could have been was Kane Brewery. We went out to remind them not to discharge anything that could be harmful to the plant.

April 3, 2018

Spoke to Longo about the gearboxes that are out for repair. They are having issues with the manufacture for the parts.

Spoke to EMI new VFD for RAS pump 3 is in. Main pump building heater due in soon. When both are in they will schedule for both to be installed.

Collection System:

Vacuumed and washed down all pump stations.

Cleaned the intersection of Deal Rd. and Stevens Rd.

Cleaned Burke's easement, Willow Dr. to Rt. 35, and Middlebrook easement.

Tv'ed 1121 Brower Blvd. for possible issue. Homeowner's problem.

Woszczak replaced lateral at 1319 Opdyke Ave. and fixed bad connection in the street at 26 Buckingham.

Waiting for 700 and 610 Auth Ave to be repaired. Cleaned both again to maintain until repaired.

Found what appeared to be a hops smell and golden water while cleaning Burke's line, reported it to Operations Manager.

18 - 39 AUTHORIZING ADJUSTMENT TO ACCOUNT NUMBER 18916-0

WHEREAS, Monmouth Property, LLC is the owner of 246 Monmouth Road in the Township of Ocean (account number 18916-0) (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, water usage in 2017 for the Property was 351,000 gallons; and

WHEREAS, Monmouth Property, LLC has provided copies of water bills for the Property from January 7, 2017 to January 4, 2018, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the water bills show average monthly usage of 2,500 gallons except for July 8, 2017 to November 7, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the increased water usage is the result of a sprinkler system; and

WHEREAS, the average monthly usage without the sprinkler system would result in annual usage of 30,000 gallons, an amount less than the usage resulting in an excess usage charge.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Township of Ocean Sewerage Authority authorizes that the 2018 usage adjustment for account 18916-0 be reduced to zero; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the 2018 annual service charge be reduced to \$460.

18 - 40 AUTHORIZING REFUND TO SUNSET VENTURES, LLC ON ACCOUNT NUMBER 18901-0

WHEREAS, Sunset Ventures, LLC is the owner of 1750 Brielle Avenue in the Township of Ocean (account number 18901-0) (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, water usage for the Property since 2010 has ranged from 46,000 gallons in 2012 and 2017 to 683,000 gallons in 2016 with an average annual usage of 174,625 gallons; and

WHEREAS, the 2017 usage of 46,000 gallons has resulted in a credit on the account of \$3,382.90; and

WHEREAS, the average annual usage, leaving out the high and low readings, would result in annual usage of 111,333 gallons, which would result in an excess usage charge of \$239.40.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Township of Ocean Sewerage Authority authorizes a refund of \$2,223.50 to Sunset Ventures, LLC.
