WORK SESSION

Executive Director's Report.

The Executive Director noted that Bill Hall is working on the dilution factor with regard to the outfall pipe. He has reviewed his numbers with a DEP representative and she agreed with his calculations. Therefore, DEP will begin the process of modifying our permits for the outfall line.

HomeServe has advised that they have home emergency coverage for 550 customers and 669 contracts. To date they have completed 51 repairs and saved customers over \$15,000.

Mr. Schmeling said that the Township is putting out a spring newsletter. He has spoken to them about TOSA having a little space in the newsletter. Mr. Galvin suggested that the first article from TOSA should provide information about the detrimental effects of flushing wipes into the system.

There was discussion about legislation that was signed into law limiting some authorities to increases to their annual service charge of no more than 2%. It was noted that there has been no clarification on this legislations.

Attorneys Report. Mr. Bonello thanked the members for his reappointment.

<u>Operations Manager Report</u>. Mr. Kwityn gave a review of his written report. He noted that the jet truck came back last week after being out of service for repairs. He noted that the truck would be out of service again for a week in March during which time the pump on it would be replaced.

He provided information about gearbox issues in the mixers on the aeration tank and the steps that have been taken to resolve them.

Mr. Schmeling provided a review of the resolutions on the agenda.

Bio-Assay was run the week of 1-22 thru 1-26

Gearbox was brought back for installation will not work drawing too many amps and tripping out. Longo has no answers to why this is happening. There bench test they say are fine. Had to send 2 more out to be rebuilt. They say nothing is wrong with them, bench test fine. Here one would not run over 40 hz. Any higher will trip out. Disconnected the motor gear box has a bad spot when it free wheels. The second just stopped. Disconnected the motor, motor ok. Put in a different gearbox in its place that runs fine. Getting no help from Longo at this point.

February 6, 2018

Mohawk Cryo came in for a week went over the PSA system. They agree that the Sieve needs to be replaced. Found the probable cause was from too hot of air. They also assisted our guys in finding other issues that were corrected. Penn Valley Pump has been contacted to revisit our pump issues. We get to about 25,000 gallons left and the pump loses prime still after we close the valves as the suggested. They are pulling out all their shop drawings to try to figure out what is going on. It seems to be leading to the gooseneck on the suction side of pump not being there, as I told them from the beginning.

Operations:

Bio-Air was here doing preliminary air studies for odor control system.

We will be doing a free sludge dewatering trial the week of March 19. This equipment supposes to use a small area for the equipment and get solids to 20 percent. I spoke to ACUA about taking test sludge when done and they will. They also expressed interest in taking the sludge if we go ahead with this type of system.

All personal are scheduled for required safety training. Will go in groups of four over three days. January, March, and May, all will be given by JIF.

Envirep was out to see if one of their products to thicken sludge would fit in our building.

Collection System:

Jet-Vacuum truck was pulled out of Absolute Truck Repair on Jan 9th. It was taken to Johnson and Towers in Mt. Laurel. They are the factory rep. repair shop for the transmission. Truck was fixed and returned. Then went to Pierce Eagle foe hose and pump repairs.

Jan 10th the 18" force main was put into service at Interlaken Pump station.

Jan 11th the bypass was flushed and air blown out and dismantled.

1 Fieldstone Ln. back pitch issue, 2805 Appleby Orangeburg pipe and 1301 Logan Orangeburg pipe were all repaired by Woszczak.

Assisted LBSA with our lateral camera.
